Outline of the Program	The program consists of two components of study: Japanese Language and Japan Studies. The Japanese language component provides students with high quality of the Japanese language training. These subjects are set as regular courses in the undergraduate programs. The Japan studies component includes all regular subjects offered by undergraduate programs. Students can choose subjects which they are interested in and deepen their friendships by learning together with regular students.

How to apply

(1) Conditions

Students who passed Level N2 of the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT), or have the same level of Japanese language study experience (600 hours).

(2) Required documents

- 1. Commitment Form (誓約書) (for the application of "Student Exchange Program") *in Japanese
- 2. Score report of Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) and certificate *if applicable
- 3. Academic Transcript
- 4. Letter of Recommendation (for the application of "Student Exchange Program")
- 5. Physical Examination Certificate
- 6. Passport copy (data)
- 7. Photo (3cm×4cm) (data)
- 8. Personal Statement

Others	
Tuition	Exchange Students are exempt from paying the tuition. However, it is necessary to pay additional charges for the excursion and other extracurricular activities.
Visa and Status	Nishogakusha University will apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (COE) at the Immigration Bureau of Japan on behalf of the exchange students. After the COE is issued, we will
of Residence	send you the COE with the permission letter from Nishogakusha University. Please apply for the Student Visa at the Embassy of Japan or the consulate general of Japan.
Insurance	Exchange Students should have travel insurance before leaving their country, which covers medical care, lost and damages while you are in Japan. In addition to having your travel insurance, exchange students will be required to join Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research ("Gakkensai") before arriving in Japan (Annual Insurance fee: about JPY1,340) and Japan's National Health Insurance after arriving in Japan (Annual Insurance fee: about JPY30,000).
Campus	Located in the heart of Tokyo, near the Imperial Palace. Kudan Campus: https://www.nishogakusha-u.ac.jp/english
Accommodation	A fully furnished shared residence ("Social Residence"), with easy access to the heart of Tokyo, is provided. It is located about a 70-minute commuting distance to Kudan campus by train and walking. Social Residence is a shared house where international students from other universities live together. Rooms are private, with tenants sharing facilities such as kitchen and living room. There will be many opportunities to use Japanese, English, Chinese, and many other languages.
	-Facilities: Self-locking entrance, shower/bath (share), kitchen (share), refrigerator (share), air conditioner, washing/drying machine (share), microwave oven (share), rice cooker (share), bed, bed sheets, pillow, eating utensils, study room, Wi-Fi, recreation room, etc. **All exchange students are required to live in the above Social Residence.
	(1) For students from Chinese Culture University: Rent is free, except for common expenses (approximately JPY 20,000/month).
	(2) For students from other universities: Rent is approx. JPY 60,000/month (including common expenses approx. JPY 20,000)Registration fee (JPY20,000) is also required.
	(Common expenses: water, electricity, gas, and Internet).
Student Services	(1) Library The Exchange Student has total access to the library.
	(2) Computer The Exchange Student receives an E-mail account and access to the computer room.
	(3) International exchange events International Center holds cross cultural events for international students. The Exchange Students are absolutely welcomed to all these events.
Pick-up service on arrival	The University will provide a free shuttle bus service to your dormitory (Social Residence), on your arrival to Japan (Narita Airport only). Pick-ups will only be available on the following dates (to be confirmed).
